EASTVALE AREA ON FUTURE COMMUNITY CENTER

Public Input Requested for New Facility and Activities

MIRA LOMA, Calif. – October 6, 2008 – The Jurupa Community Services District (JCSD) Parks and Recreation is mailing a survey to Eastvale residents to determine the type of facility needed for the future Eastvale Community Center. While the survey is randomly distributed to about 35 percent of the Eastvale residences, anyone in that area who would like to give input on the facility and the proposed activities can participate by sending their comments to Richard Welch, Director of Parks & Recreation at rwelch@jcsd.us or picking up a copy of the survey at the District headquarters at 11201 Harrel St.

The survey will be sent mid-October and should be returned by October 31, 2008. Additional comments are welcome at the Parks & Recreation committee meetings, held at Jurupa Community Services board room. The next Parks & Recreation committee meeting is October 22, 2008 at 11:30 a.m. at JCSD headquarters.

Plans for the proposed community center include providing space for the JCSD Parks & Recreation classes that are currently held in a number of locations throughout the community. Other potential uses for the center include performances, meetings, banquets and other community programs. With more than 1,500 children and adults participating in programs, the new facility is an integral part of being able to provide services to this growing community. The survey results will give public input to the Board of Directors as they proceed with the planning of the Community Center.

Founded in 1956, The Jurupa Community Services District (JCSD) is a public agency known as a Special District, governed by a 5-member, elected, Board of Directors. JCSD is responsible for providing water, sewer and street lights for over 85,000 people and for maintaining more than 100 acres of parks and over 25 miles of frontage landscape in an unincorporated, 48-square-mile region of western Riverside County.
