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WATER PIPELINE CONSTRUCTION BEGINS FOR EASTVALE SOUTH CENTER

Pipeline Installation and Flushing May Bring Traffic Delays on Limonite

MIRA LOMA, Calif. – July 19, 2010 – Jurupa Community Services District (JCSD) is overseeing the installation of water pipelines for the new Eastvale South Shopping Center at Limonite and Hamner. While the new lines are being installed, some water flushing will be necessary for proper sanitation of the potable drinking water carried through these pipelines. Construction may bring occasional minor traffic delays during the overnight hours along Limonite between Hamner and the I-15 Freeway. The process will be completed by the end of September.

Robert Tock, JCSD Director of Engineering & Operations said, “While it may appear to customers that we are wasting water when water lines are flushed, this process is standard operating procedure. The process is necessary to maintain the integrity of the water quality and to ensure public health and safety.”

Eastvale South is a 60,000-square-foot mixed use center under development by Lewis Retail Centers, which will include a Walgreens, McDonald’s, Taco Bell and Chevron, directly across from Eastvale Gateway community center.
