JURUPA COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT TAKES PART IN SOLAR PROJECT CELEBRATION

Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant Opens 1- Megawatt Solar Power System

MIRA LOMA, Calif. – January 7, 2009 – Jane Anderson, Vice President of the Jurupa Community Services District (JCSD) Board of Directors, spoke today at the opening celebration event of the SunPower Corp. 1-megawatt solar power system for the Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant. The recently completed solar project will, at its peak, generate the equivalent of 25 percent of the power needed to run the wastewater treatment plant. Mrs. Anderson said, “This project reduces our carbon footprint, protects the environment and helps reduce energy costs.”



The treatment plant, located at 14634 River Road in Corona, is managed by Western Municipal Water District in Riverside, California. The Joint Powers Authority (JPA) partners for this plant include Jurupa Community Services District, Home Gardens Sanitary District, the City of Norco and the Santa Ana River Watershed Project Authority (SAWPA).

SunPower Corp. designed and constructed the high-efficiency solar power system. More than 5,000 solar panels cover 9 acres. The solar panels track the sun, increasing sunlight capture by up to 30 percent more than conventional systems. Western will buy the electricity at prices that are competitive with retail rates, providing the District with a long-term hedge against rising power prices for no capital investment.
