## Western and Jurupa Community Services District Partner to Fund High Efficiency Toilets for Senior Housing Complex

**RIVERSIDE, CA—February 12, 2010** —Western Municipal Water District and Jurupa Community Services District (JCS D) have agreed to fund the installation of 1,238 high-efficiency toilets at the Country Village Senior Apartments in Mira Loma. The water districts each will pay \$52,615 for a total of \$105,230.

“Replacing that many toilets will save our region roughly 17 million gallons per year,” said Don Galleano, the Western Board Director that represents the Jurupa region. “For a visual perspective, that’s enough water to cover more than 50 football fields.”

In spring 2009, Country Village’s property management company requested funding assistance for the replacement of its non-conserving toilets with high-efficient toilets, which use only 1.28 gallons of water per flush. Removal of the old toilets and installation of the high-efficiency toilets at Country Village is nearly complete.
