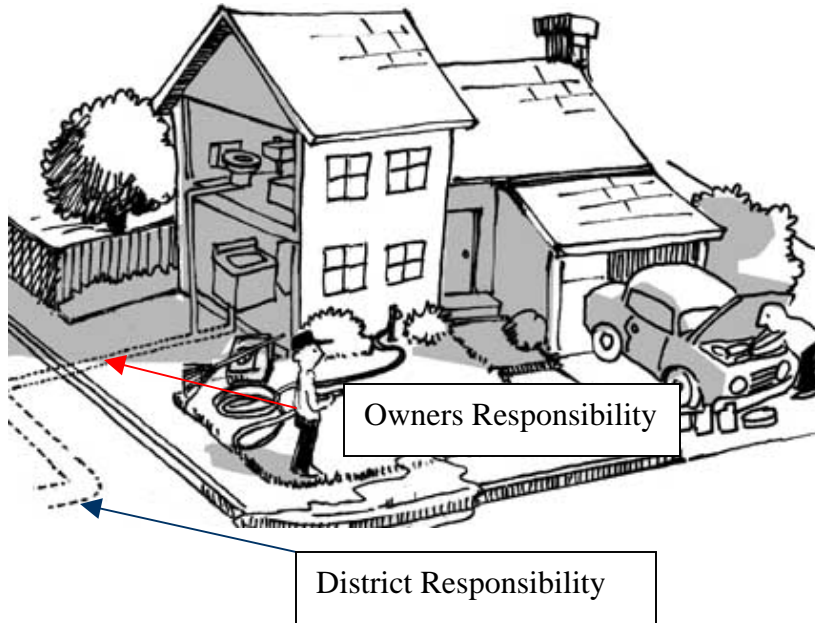


WHAT DO YOU DO IF YOUR SEWER STOPS UP? County Policy Regarding Sewer Maintenance



1 Call the District First! We'll check the main sewer.

When sewer problems are experienced, the resident should first contact the District. We will check the main sewer and, if there is a cleanout existing at ground level, we will also inspect that to determine if the stoppage is in the service sewer or the building site.

2 Property Owner's Responsibility! If the main is OK, we recommend that you then call a plumbing or sewer contractor.

The owner of the property is responsible for keeping the sewer clear between the building and the main. If there is no cleanout at ground level, the owner is also responsible for clearing the service sewer to the main sewer. Locating the building sewer, the owner's responsibility, although we will attempt to assist with available records and information. We suggest the owner employ a plumbing or sewer contractor to clear any stoppages in the building or service sewer. The contractor should contact us before closing the excavation.

NOTE: Although there is no extra charge for our services (the work financed by district sewer bills). We will not assume the cost of your contractor's call, regardless of the location of the stoppage!
