## **Maloof Discovery Garden**

The model gardens include a Southwest Garden, a Woodland Garden, a Mediterranean Garden, a turf demonstration area to compare water use of different types of turf and much more.

## **University of California - Riverside Botanic Gardens**

Covering 400 acres, the living plant museum has more than 3,500 plant species from around the world. Its collection include native California plants, rose, cactus, herb, iris gardens as well as a subtropical fruit orchard. The garden showcases different grades of synthetic turf, California Friendly plants, and water-efficient irrigation systems such as drip lines and smart controllers. All trees, plants, and other materials were selected to provide year-round color and be compatible with the existing soil type. The garden is open to the public during normal working hours with self-guided tour materials available. In addition, guided tours may be scheduled.
